Unveiling the Underground Threat: The Battle Against Lawn Grubs

Grubs are the small, white, c-shaped larvae of Japanese beetles, June beetles, and chafers. They live just underneath the lawn's root system and feed on the roots of grass and plants. Grubs can cause significant damage because they change to pupae after feeding on grass roots, which hatch into beetles. The beetles feed on plants and flowers and lay their eggs on the lawn during the summer. Those eggs hatch into grubs in the fall, and the whole vicious cycle begins again when the grubs emerge the following spring.

As the larvae continue to feed, areas of your beautiful lawn will start to turn brown. Your yard will also begin to feel spongy when you walk on it. The good news is that there is a fairly easy way to determine if grubs are the culprit. Simply pull on the grass plants. In essence, the grass will pull up much like a carpet and expose the grubs that are feeding underneath. Grubs are usually white in color. They're also shaped like the letter C.

A preventative grub treatment application will go a long way in ensuring a damage-free lawn. In addition, a healthy lawn also acts as its own defense system, providing natural pest control. For example, dense turf isn't the preferred environment for grubs. You can take several steps to keep your lawn thick, green, beautiful, and thriving while deterring grubs. It's also essential to have your lawn mowed at the proper height. For example, beetles don't like to lay their eggs in tall grass, so mowing will help deter the egg-laying process. Applying a grub treatment sometime between late May and mid-July is also a good solution.
