Organic Gardening in Northeast Ohio 101

What is organic gardening? Organic gardening consists of many basic ideas and practices, but I would like to focus on only the main principles.

Organic gardening starts in the soil; this is the key to lush, full plants. Nutrient-rich soil typically has an abundance of microorganisms, nutrients and earthworms. Healthy soil also retains water and nutrients as well as allows drainage and good airflow. All of these are a must for "healthy" soil. Most yards do not have the perfect soil waiting to be planted. The good news is that there are plenty of options to get us started to a healthy garden for fruits and veggies all summer and fall. Here are my steps to get started on your first garden.

- Pick out the perfect area with good sunlight and airflow.
- Mark out the size area you want to have a garden in.
- Perform a deep tilling of that area. Clean out and dispose of rocks, roots and debris that was turned up in the tilling process.
- Perform a soil test to see what type of soil you have and what nutrients should be added to balance the pH of the soil and give your plants the best opportunity.
- Since you are going with organic gardening, you will want to be clear that all soil amendments must be natural composts, manures or elements.

I till in a layer of compost and sand to my garden every spring. The sand gives the soil a loamier composition. This allows air to flow easier through the top layer of soil, allows better drainage, keeps soil compaction down which helps roots spread faster and farther, and allows nutrients to be absorbed easier by the plants.

Till again after all soil amendments have been spread evenly. Till several times in a checkerboard pattern to allow for the best cultivation and spread of nutrients. Rake out the soil into evenly spaced rows, leaving plenty of room for air circulation when plants are mature. I like to leave rows 30" apart in my garden. After this last step, you are ready to get planting. Follow directions for all your seeds and potted plants. Spacing and depth are the most important. Good luck this year!
